BACKGROUND TO THE CONFERENCE

STREAM is a £1 million conservation project centred on the River Avon and Avon Valley Natura 2000 designated sites in southern England. It is one of the largest river restoration projects undertaken in the UK, and has developed a range of innovative techniques to restore, monitor and manage lowland rivers and floodplains. The project has taken action on

1. River restoration
2. Linking river and valley
3. Monitoring
4. Raising awareness of the river system

Under the Water Framework and Habitats Directive, an increasing amount of river restoration work is being planned across Europe. The conference will demonstrate practical aspects of how to plan, manage and implement a large programme of river restoration, develop detailed whole-river restoration plans, and integrate management of river and floodplain Natura 2000 designated sites.

Conference aims

To demonstrate innovative techniques for planning and delivering restoration, monitoring and management of lowland rivers and floodplains.

Who should attend?

Anyone involved in river restoration, including river and fishery managers, specialists, academics and competent authorities from the UK and around Europe.

Costs

There is a small fee for attending the conference and dinner, and delegates are responsible for their own travel and accommodation costs. Discretionary discounts are available for students, participants from EC ascendency states, Trusts and small NGOs.
